



BJOG has a new Editor-in-Chief from January 2022!

We're delighted to announce that BJOG's new Editor-in-Chief from January 2022 will be Professor Aris Papageorgiou, who is currently one of the Deputy Editors-in-Chief of the journal. Aris is a Clinician-Scientist who divides his time between Oxford University where he is Professor of Fetal Medicine and the Research Director of the Oxford Maternal and Perinatal Health Institute; and St George's Hospital, where he works clinically as a Professor of Fetal Medicine. He is an expert in fetal medicine and ultrasound, fetal growth and pre-eclampsia, non-invasive and invasive prenatal diagnosis, and fetal therapy.

He studied medicine at the University of Sheffield. He was also a Research Fellow at the Harris Birthright Research Centre for Fetal Medicine at King's College, from where he obtained his MD on large scale population screening for the prediction of pre-eclampsia. He completed his obstetric training in London with specialisations in both Obstetrics & Gynaecology; and subspecialist training in Maternal & Fetal Medicine, whilst lecturing at St George's, University of London.

Aris runs a focussed research programme in the areas of maternal, fetal and perinatal health, using diverse methods. These have included global projects in low resource settings using ultrasound, biomarkers and clinical methods of phenotyping growth and development, and to improve maternal, fetal and newborn outcomes. Related to this work he has developed collaborative research with biomedical engineers to use artificial intelligence (AI) in pregnancy imaging and screening and co-founded the Oxford University spin-out, Intelligent Ultrasound.

Previously, Aris has served as a trustee, Chair of the Scientific Committee and Honorary Secretary for the International Society of Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and was awarded the ISUOG Fellowship in 2019. He is the Chair of the Expert Working Group in Obstetrics and Gynaecology for NHS Digital; and visiting Professor at Capital Medical University in Beijing. He has also received the prestigious Honorary Membership of the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine; and *Doctor Honoris Causa* from the University of Athens.

We'd like to thank Professor Michael Marsh for his dedicated and inspirational leadership over his term as Editor-in-Chief. We're very happy to say Mike will continue to be involved with BJOG, as Emeritus Editor-in-Chief.
